Minor in Mediterranean/Middle East Studies

The Minor in Mediterranean/Middle East Studies can be pursued by any undergraduate at the University, regardless of primary major or college. Successful completion of the program will be indicated by a certificate attached to the student's diploma and academic transcript.

Requirements

- Completion of Intermediate Arabic (MEAR 20003)
- The student's choice of 3 courses that relate to the region of southern Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East
- A final research thesis that integrates course work related to the student's area of interest.

Successful completion of the program will be indicated by a certificate distributed at the end of the academic year.
